

**Adherence to Connecticut Interscholastic Conference (C.I.A.C.) Regulations**

The Board of Education requires that high school athletic programs, above all else, must be conducted in a manner that teaches students the necessity of always adhering to the rules that have been established for these programs and to the generally accepted rules of fair play. For this reason, the Board expects that the coaches of the high school athletic teams will abide in every instance with the letter and spirit of the regulations that have been established by the Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference (C.I.A.C.). Coaches must model by all of their behaviors the values, which the athletic program teaches.

The Board of Education also expects the administration to monitor vigilantly the activities of high school athletic coaches in order to provide assurance that all C.I.A.C. regulations are being observed in spirit and by letter. Further, the Board expects the administration to take effective action to stop the activities of any coach which are in violation of C.I.A.C. regulations and to take effective disciplinary action that is designed to prevent future violations.
