

School Attendance Areas

The Wallingford Board of Education establishes attendance areas or districts within the school system. The Board shall redistrict or revise school attendance areas whenever such revision is deemed necessary. Among the factors that may be considered in the process are:

1. Relative distance and convenience by regularly traveled routes.
2. Age and grade level of children involved.
3. Number and seating capacity of teaching stations and other school facilities available, as related to enrollment projections.
4. Major traffic arteries and other hazards.
5. Natural boundaries, such as rivers, lakes, railroad right-of-ways, and major industrial installations.
6. Effective use of building space.
7. Stability of boundary lines as they relate to enrollment projections.
8. Consideration of the effect on enrollments, use of space, and other factors at adjacent schools.
9. Reasonable distance for as many students as possible.
10. Boundaries coterminous with middle and high school boundaries whenever possible.

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
