### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### **A.C.E.S. Representative**

Mrs. Castelli reported that the committee reviewed the Governor's Education Reform Proposal. She announced that the first meeting of the Curriculum Consortium was held. She stated that the expectations of that group are that by the second week in August there will be two units available per grade for content area. She reported that ACES would be offering seven professional development days regarding the State Common Core Standards. They will be held in June and will be free.

#### **Wintergreen Magnet School Steering Committee**

Mr. Votto reported that they reviewed what the month of March was like. He said 15 teachers went to a professional development workshop on Common Core Standards. They discussed the budget and it was passed.

#### **Building Committee Representative for Vo-Ag Building Project**

Dr. Menzo reported that the project is being finished and should be closed out soon.

**School to Career Representative**

Dr. Menzo reported that the next meeting is scheduled for May 14<sup>th</sup>. He reported that they plan to meet with business leaders to bring them up to date. He said there are a number of grant opportunities that would require businesses to be a participant of those grants. He stated that based on a meeting today with the outplacement facility representatives we would like to have them come to talk about internships for students. He said the businesses have been very supportive. He reported that the district has received some donations for the Innovation Project and tremendous support. He announced that 3M made a donation of 200 digital cameras with assistance from Randy Backus and Ellen Cohn.

**Diversity in Action Committee Representative**

Mrs. McKay reported she hasn't been able to attend the meetings. She reported that Friday, April 27<sup>th</sup> is Celebrity Reading Day when local celebrities, central office staff, and others will read to second and third grade students. She said Sharlene Wong has spearheaded this project for the past five years and does a great job.

**Report from Roof Project Committee Representative**

Mr. Marrone reported that the bids on the roof project are coming in. He said the committee will be going before the Town Council to talk about the bids.

**PTAC Update**

Dr. Menzo reported that the two big topics of discussion were the Budget and Bylaw changes. He said the Bylaws were changed to set an agenda, the strategic plan, to get as much representation as possible and get as many people involved. He reported that Jan Guarino was there to present Bullying legislation and School Climate Surveys. He said they asked the members what topics they were interested in hearing about.

Mr. Votto said this is a great way to get parents to voice their opinions. He said it's a great system and he is very pleased with it.

He reported that the funds from these grants would be used to expand and/or improve educational programs and services for adults who lack the level of basic skills and literacy necessary to be effective parents. He explained that there are three areas for program improvement funds. They are the English Literacy and Civics Education, Family Literacy Services and Preparing for the Twenty-first Century Careers. He said the funding would be for one year with the possibility of continuation in subsequent years.

**Presentation of Proposed Adoption of New Policy: Comparability of Services – 6161.3**

Mrs. Cohn reported that this is the third reading of this policy. She said this policy has been reviewed by the Policy Committee which is Mrs. Castelli, Mr. Votto and herself. She said it was also presented at the Instructional Committee meeting this month. She explained that this is a boiler plate policy that is required by the State for all grant recipients for Title I. She said nine schools were indentified as Title I schools. She said this is determined by how many free lunches there are.

Mrs. Guarino reported that this policy was also read at the Instructional Committee. She explained that we are required to have this policy since we collect insurance payments and need to make our employees aware what the policy is. The Privacy Officer is to make people aware of this policy.

Mrs. Cohn explained that the district is in the time of transition of changing all the policies. If someone is looking for a policy on the website they can go to the old policy and it will direct them to the new policy.

**ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT**

Dr. Menzo gave his administrative report as listed below.

- The Community outreach to businesses has been going very well
- He reached out to Quinnipiac University students in the fall and they will bring flip cameras overseas and bring back information for students in World Language classes and Social Studies classes across the district. He has organized through Carrie Laudadio to meet with some staff members at various levels to work on a project and how they will follow through with it.

- A Special Education Outplacement facility group meeting was held today. A strategic plan was discussed with them. There was a lot of discussion about how we can work collaboratively in terms of professional development for our staff. We've invited the outplacement facilities directors to be part of our district management teams.
- He announced that this weekend there will be a production at Yalesville entitled "Honk" which is a Disney version of "The Ugly Duckling". This production is a Highland/Yalesville production. It will be held both Friday and Saturday with another show at the Senior Center on May 14<sup>th</sup>.

Mrs. Wong, Food Service Director, shared some information on a few things she has been working on.

- She, Linda Winters and Dr. Menzo have been working on some ideas and strategies on ways to reduce the food service program deficit. She did a survey and from that survey made some changes to the menus. She explained that if she reduced the cost of lunches she would have to reduce what she offers. She needs to offer a good variety of foods to meet state mandates.
- She reported that she has some potential to generate some revenue activity with High Road School. She has assembled some data to present to you at the next Operations Committee meeting.
- She is collecting information from other school districts in the DRG to find out how much they are subsidizing their food service program.
