STUDENT BOARD REPRESENTATIVES

Michaela Mendygral, Mark T. Sheehan High School Student Board representative came before the Board to give her report.

- Student Council has been working eagerly to put together fundraising activities for the school
- Pennies for Patients collection for the leukemia and lymphoma society will take place on March 23rd until April 10th. Buckets will be in the school parking lots when students arrive and leave as well as during lunch waves to collect any spare change.
- Student Council is also looking for volunteers at a pasta dinner for a former Sheehan student, Tyler Tomer, who graduated with the class of 2005. He is currently battling cancer and the Wallingford Community is looking for any way to help.
- Student Council is putting together a farewell to seniors with a fundraiser selling cards where other students can write to a senior. The cards will be left on the students chairs during graduation.

Recognition of Retirees

Dr. Menzo reported that prior to this meeting there was a reception held for all the retirees in the district and they will each be recognized for their accomplishments and will receive a certificate from the Board.

Todd Snyder, Assistant Principal from Lyman Hall, came before the Board to speak on Sue Renkuns behalf. He said that she worked for the school system for 45 years. James Gaffey was called before the Board and Todd Snyder said a few kind words about him and announced that James was a reporter before he became a teacher. Cecelia Schuster came before the Board and Todd said she always made sure students came first and loved the Key Club where she spent countless hours. Todd explained that Susan Gomes chaired the English department for ten years and teaching was her second career.

Deborah Young was not available therefore, Cindy Lavalette reported that she was a dedicated and enthusiastic teacher. She also teaches Earth Science at Gateway Community College.

Rob Mancusi came before the Board to speak on behalf of Pam Krombel who has worked at Sheehan High School for 35 years. He also spoke on behalf of Denise Strom who worked at Stevens, Highland, and Cook Hill over the years.

Carrie LaTorre called Kathy Palermo up to say that she has kept the students and staff fit over the past twenty years.

Rob Ariciero, Principal at Moses Y. Beach, spoke on behalf of Nancy Chapin, Wendy Wheeler and Diane DeLibero. He said he sent email out to staff each time one of them let him know that they were leaving and expressed his disappointment at their leaving.

Sashi Govin, Principal at Dag Hammarskjold, came before the Board to say a few nice words about Lorraine Anderson and Rick Harkawik.

Joe Piacentini, Principal at Moran Middle School, spoke on Kimberly Eslers behalf and Cindy Lavalette spoke about Fern Pucciarello also.

Vicky Reed, Principal at Highland School, said that Patty Pursell has been a Physical Education teacher for twenty years in Wallingford.

Rob Mancusi spoke about Leigh Mascia and reported that she has been a teacher for forty-one years.

Cindy Lavalette announced that Carrie Wall was the first full-time Librarian at Pond Hill School.

Recognition of Michelle DelBuono for creating the Smarter Balanced Digital Library

Dr. Menzo called Michelle DelBuono before the Board to recognize her for hard work to get her doctorate and thanked her for representing Wallingford so well at the State Department. She is also being recognized tonight for creating the Smarter Balanced Digital Library for the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium.

QUESTION AND ANSWER SESSION

Kate Eber, a former Sheehan student, came before the Board and asked Dr. Menzo how his decision was made to remove "The Perks of Being a Wallflower" from the curriculum. She was also concerned that one parent could have the book removed.

Dr. Menzo responded by saying it wasn't about using the book but how it was being used. He suggested that some research be done before the book is used in the curriculum again. He is recommending that this summer the ninth grade curriculum be discussed to talk about how we're teaching literature. He said it was not a required reading book. He said he would like the teachers to be have a chance to voice their opinion to the Board.

Steven Goot, Williams Place, came before the Board to say he was confused by the Superintendent's explanation.

Dr. Menzo explained that the book was being used only by two teachers in three freshman classes and won't be used in the classroom again until September or November once it has been researched in the curriculum. He said there was no interruption of using the book for teaching since those classes were done with it. He said he just hit a pause button for now until the research is done. He also said the curriculum was in a pilot program last year and was put through a process.

Mr. Will Marotti, a parent, said his son is a freshman at Sheehan and he thought Dr. Menzo's explanation about the issue shed some light. He said that there is a difference in the maturity levels from freshman to seniors and that parents who want to be involved in their children's lives want to know what their children are reading.

David Amato, 68 Germania Street, Southington, came before the Board as a former Sheehan student who had been bullied and felt left out. He said he understands what the book is about and thinks that other students should read it.

Holly LaFond, a parent, came before the Board to ask some questions about filing and the process for appealing the complaint by the previous parent.

Susan Gomes, Edgewood Drive, said the English Department support the fact that the curriculum development process needs to be reviewed and they want to start a positive dialogue.
