A.C.E.S. Representative

Mrs. Castelli reported the highlights of the A.C.E.S. April meeting included student recognition for the CT Shakespeare Competition where both first and second place were awarded to ECA students. ECA is a magnet school run by ACES. Of the 21 students participating, Zoe Oliver from North Haven won first place and D'Mahdnes Failey of West Haven took second place. Zoe will now go on to Lincoln Center for the national competition. A presentation of the State of Connecticut self-insured medical insurance was given. All municipalities and boards of education may inquire and apply to participate if so inclined. The auditing firm, Cohnen Resnick, was selected for this year's audit. Firms have been selected for the Leederhill and Trumbull Street facilities. Newfield Construction will do Leederhill and Silver Petrucelli will handle Trumbull Street. Meeting minutes, fiscal services, Human Resource and Early Head Start reports were all accepted. Tuition rates for the Preschool Program at Village Street school were approved for \$7,500 for ACES employees and \$8,775 for all others. This program incorporates special needs with nonspecial needs students, a model that has seen great benefits for the special needs kids. The core subject three year cycle for curriculum rewrites begins and the SBAC and CTAA (alternative assessment) are both underway.
