PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

RECOGNITION OF STAFF MEMBERS OF THE MONTH

Dr. Menzo called Vicky Reed, Principal at Highland Elementary School, before the Board to present certificates to the Staff Members of the Month from her school. RECOGNITION OF STUDENT FINALISTS IN STATE INVENTION CONVENTION

Dr. Menzo called Karen Ripa, STEP teacher in the grades 3-5 schools, before the Board to have her present certificates to the students. The first certificate she presented was to Ryan Lagasse who received the highest award, *Superintendent's Award for Innovative Thinking*. She explained that he won this out of 120 inventors. Dr. Menzo gave his report on items listed below.

- Gifts donated to the school district totaled \$163,835 this year with a total of \$1.1 million since 1994. The last three years have raised one third of the funds
- The Food Truck will be at the Gaylord Hospital for their event on Saturday from 8:30 to 4:00 p.m. The students will be serving breakfast and lunch. A donation of \$3,000 from the Wallingford Education Foundation was made to help the truck get started. Every Saturday starting from July 12 through September 14 the truck will be at the Farmers Market on the Wallingford Green.
- Wallingford will be hosting a consortium from Harvard and will include members from Meriden, Norwalk and Newport, Rhode Island. It is a consortium on Innovation and Creativity.
- Ken Daly and Melanie Montagnon plus four other members will attend and are eligible for Nellie Mae Funds.
- A Great Schools Partnership will take place for a two day session in August to discuss high school standards and align the K-12.
- Dr. Menzo commended the grades 3 – 5 principals for pulling together the orientations as all the 3-5 schools.
- Summer work to be done will include Lyman Hall asbestos abatement and will be done with CRA funds after July 1st.
- Graduation will be on June 24th for both Sheehan and Lyman Hall High Schools. We have collaboration with the town churches and historical society who are willing to ring the bells in honor of the graduates in conjunction with the Wallingford 100 which is committed to the success of every child in Wallingford.
