## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **A.C.E.S Representative**

Since Mrs. Castelli was not available, Mr. Miller read a report from Mrs. Castelli. "CT Speaker of the House, Sharkey, has stated the common calendar mandated date has been pushed out one year mainly to allow for union negotiations to be modified as necessary. The Mill road School lease will be extended to 2034 in order to allow for a necessary roof replacement. In order to receive State reimbursement, the lease must be in effect for a 20 year period from the time of the roof replacement. Magnet School funding outside the Sheff region is presently unknown, therefore we will fill this year's enrollment numbers but not expand the number unless funding is granted. ACES will end the year financially on a positive note. The unencumbered fund will be added to the retained earnings. Unlike our own district, ACES has no one to request funds from for capital projects and must rely on retained earnings in order to fulfill capital projects. The Board approved an average wage increase of

3.3% for the non-represented (no union) employees. Supporting documentation comparing the new rates for these folks to the districts ACES supports, clearly shows these increases fall well within appropriate ranges. The 2012-2017 Strategic Plan draft was reviewed. A presentation of the ACES ICES (International Center for Education and Services) was given. ICES offers a wide range of professional development opportunities with real-world relevance that include key topics in education as well as customized learning experiences that address specific needs and interests. This is something we should certainly take a closer look at to determine the value to our district that may be found within ICES.”
